BRAMLICH COLLEGE ATHLETIC HALL OF FAME TO HOLD INDUCTION CEREMONY

BRAMLICH, Minn. (Sept. 20, 2019) — The Bramlich College Alumni Club will be inducting four alumni to the Bramlich College Athletic Hall of Fame in a ceremony Saturday, Oct. 12 at the Bramlich College Field House.

Inductees include: Allison Dobson, 48, a 1988 graduate from Clarence, New York; Geoffrey Brown, 62, a 1974 graduate from Kalamazoo, MI; Colleen Dubay, 50, a 1986 graduate from Pittsburgh, PA; and Michael Shotter, 59, a 1977 graduate from North Andover, MA.

“We’re so proud of our inductees, and I look forward to celebrating their accomplishments,” said Marcus Irvin, president of the Bramlich College Alumni Club.

Dobson played on the NCAA Division II national champion tennis team 1986-1987. Brown had a record-breaking 1973-1974 season on the men’s hockey team, having scored 30 total goals. Dubay was an NCAA Division II women’s gymnastics champion in 1986. Shotter set an unbroken record of 1:47.13 in the 200 individual medley event at the 1977 NCAA Division II men’s swimming and diving championship.

Irvin will be presenting the inductees with their certificates at the induction ceremony. After the ceremony, inductees’ photos will be added to the Bramlich Field House Honor Wall.
